<i>Revolutionize mobility</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reimagine mobility by working with, rather than against, climate. • Create interdisciplinary mobility working groups to explore and enact climate routing measures, disaster planning, and just transition.
<i>Prioritize vital mobility</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prioritize movement of goods, people, and services that impact life chances. • Invest in telemedicine as alternate to in-person mobility.
<i>Embrace green and blue</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Invest in programs, such as Living Shorelines, that enhance ecosystems and the storm defences they provide. • Invest in climate and weather monitoring technology, including citizen science.
<i>Rebrand redundancy</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support redundancies across multiple scales, including roads, generators, and batteries. • Embrace a “root cellar approach” to strategically pre-position goods, energy, and expertise.
<i>Think flex</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop community disaster preparedness plans that allow for prompt and flexible response and, if needed, evacuation. • Build flexibility into everyday mobilities, from commuting to supply chains.

Five recommendations are based on input and ideas garnered through research interviews in impacted communities.

I move from larger scales, revolutionizing mobility at national levels, to smaller scales, taking a flexible approach to individual travel planning.
